



First Grant Types to Target?

Fellowships

Training

Complex Research (Rs, Ps, Us)



Fellowships

Pros:

- Simple grants
- Easily Identified

Cons:

- Different application/data
- Small number of grants, ~1,500 per year



Training

Pros:

- Could present data from 2271 submission
- Easily Identified

Cons:

Small number of grants, ~1,500 per year



Complex Research

Pros:

- Largest population, ~4,000 per year and growing
- Could eventually provide ability to upload subproject budget
- Committed budget data could imported or viewed.

Cons:

- Multi-budget adds programming complexity
- Data entry could be a burden



Options

- Expand eSNAP to add simple budget info for single budget grants (F, T, simple others)
- Expand to include document upload of all other budget data (multi budget Ps Us others)

- Expand to include data import of structured data.
- Create system-to-system transaction set.
